I have read the letters attached to your memorandum of August 9, 1961, regarding our opinion relating to forfeiture of an examination fee should an applicant fail to appear for a retake examination.

When that opinion was rendered, it was our supposition that the applicant had not contacted the Commission before the retake examination and requested a continuance to the next retake examination. Under such a circumstance of a request of a continuance before the retake examination, the Commission within its discretion would be justified in permitting a continuance until the next retake examination and applying the \$10.00 examination fee to the next retake examination.
