Dear Don:

I have your letter of September 1, 1961, inquiring about the Jury Commissioners sending notices by certified mail rather than registered mail. I, of course, agree with you that where the statute says "registered mail", it would not be safe to use anything else.

I find that Chapter 217, Public Laws of 1961, has taken care of this matter so that where the statute says "registered mail", certified mail may now be used. This law, of course, will go into effect September 16, 1961.
