At the September 21st meeting of the Business Manager's at the Augusta State Hospital Mr. Simonson asked if State highways bordering and running through the property of the Reformatory for Men fall within the rules and regulations under Chapter 164, P.L.'61. After considering the Statute in the light of this question I have come to the conclusion that such highways were not intended to be included within these rules and regulations, but merely the roads and driveways used for entrance into, exit from and passage through the property for purposes connected directly with the Men's Reformatory; employees, visitors, etc.
