Remard Maselton, Countinent to Referentury for Hem, Sec. 67, Chapter 27.

In situations such as the one presented in your recent memo -- the countinent of Edward Resolven to the Beformstery for New for an indeterminate sentence to trunky-one years, reference to Senties 67, Chapter 27, Revised Statutes of Mains, 195h, quoted below, provides the solution.

The court or trial justice ardering permitment shall not prescribe the limit thereof but so make committed to the Reformatory shall be held for more than three years. If through eversight or ethermise any pursue he committed to the justice of the main sections of the period of the person as committed shall not be veld but the person so committed shall be entitled to the benefit and subject to the provisions of this pection in the same manner and to the state extents as if the countiment had been in the series required by this section. In such case the Superintendent of the Reformatory shall deliver to each affected a copy of Sections 66 b 75 inclusive.

Since Edward Hagelton began his sentence at the Reformatory for Men en September 2, 1960 and since although presently confined in the Maine State Prison, he is nevertheless a Referencery insate, he campt, under the section quoted above, he hald beyond September 2, 1963.
