Montal Health and Gerrections

On October 11, 1962 you inquired of this office whether an examiner of income convicts appointed under Section 122 of Chapter 27 may also be called upon by a Manicipal Court Judge to give evidence as provided for in Section 123 of the same Chapter.

It is the spinion of this office that the language of Section 123, in part as follows: "and shall require and receive evidence of at least 2 reputable physicians not in the employ of either of the said juils", not only precludes an examiner of impuse convicts from giving evidence as one of the two physicians, under Section 123 in his own Security but also precludes him from performing such function under Section 123 in any other County in the State, such examiner being considered to be in the amploy of a jail.
