**Subsidy --- School Administrative District #3**

This is in answer to your memorandum of November 6, 1962, regarding subsidy payments to S.A.D.#3.

Chapter 41, section 237-6, provides for a 10 % bonus in the State subsidy to school administrative districts provided the district "within 4 years of the time of its formation" has one secondary facility serving all the pupils in grades 9 thru 12 in the district.

S.A.D.#3 was re-formed on March 3, 1959, with the addition of the towns of Brooks and Jackson. Private & Special Laws of 1959, Chapter 221, reconstituted and established S.A.D.#3 as of March 3, 1959.

It is my opinion that the 4-year period provided by section 237-6 commences now on March 3, 1959, since it appears that S.A.D.#3 was reconstituted on that date by legislative fiat.
