Sebsidy --- School Administrative District #1

This is in answer to your memorandum of November 6, 1962, regarding subsidy payments to S.A.D.63.

Chapter 41, section 337-4, provides for a 10 % beaus in the State subsidy to school administrative districts provided the district "within 4 years of the time of its formation" has one secondary facility serving all the pupils in grades 5 thru 13 in the district.

S.A.D.@3 was re-Sermed on March S, 1959, with the addition of the terms of Brooks and Jackson. Private & Special Laws of 1950, Chapter 221, reconstituted and established S.A.D.@3 as of March S. 1950.

It is my opinion that the 6-year period provided by section 237-6 commences amos on March S, 1989, since it appears that S.A.D.#3 was reconstituted on that date by legislative flat.
