Dear Senator Wyman;

We are in receipt of your request for an opinion as to the constitutionality of the new draft of S. P. 481, L. D. 1333, which states:

"R. S., C. 37-A, § 72, sub-§ 21, E, amended. Paragraph 8 of subsection II of section 72 of chapter 37-A of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section I of chapter 331 of the public laws of 1959, is amended to read as follows:

'I, The dealer who purchases such most is sequired to file a monthly statement of shipments received with the commissioner on farms furnished by the commissioner may, notwithstanding the other provisions of this chapter, obtain a permit for the processing of such lobster meat if it conforms to the legal standards of the states or countries from which it originates, provided that the processor gives bond (... to the commissioner that such meat shall not be sold within the State and that he will comply with all rules and regulations prescribed by the commissioner opening transportation and processing of such meat. The word "Maine" shall not appear
