Dear Senator Wymani

We are in receipt of your request for an opinion as to whether county commissioners can be personally liable for moneys borrowed by a county in anticipation of tax revenues.

We answer in the negative. It is a basic principle of common law that persons in the category of municipal, county, or state officials act only in their representative capacity as an agent, and not individually. A county is liable for the acts of its agents. Morse v. Montville, 115 Me. 458. See also: Stone v. Augusta, 46 Me. 139; Donahue v. Richards, 38 Me. 392; Wilson v. Simmons, 89 Me. 242; Hovev v. Mayo, 43 Me. 322. The county is liable for misfeasance or nonfeasance of its agents, but would not be liable for malfeasance, which would in effect amount to a criminal act. Such is not the case here.

The county is liable for the amount of the debt owed. See the leading case of <u>Blood v. Beal</u>, 100 Me. 30 (1905). See also: <u>Wakem v.Caribou National Bank</u>, 137 Me. 127 (1940), where on p. 131 the court cited with approval <u>Athens National Bank v. Ridgebury Township</u>, 303 Pa. 479, 154 A. 791, which stated:

"The loans were none the less valid because the supervisors used the current revenue for other purposes than their repayment." Honorable J. Hollis Wyman -2- June 14, 1963
