In answer to our conversation of this morning dealing with the subject of attorneys taking a broker's examination, please be advised that it is the official opinion of this Office that any attorney who is a graduate of a law school accepted by the Maine Board of Bar Examiners does thereby satisfy the requirements of Chapter 84, § 2-A, I-E as it pertains to the completion of an educational course in the field of real estate approved by the Commission. If the applicant otherwise qualifies, you must thereby issue him a license.

I trust that the above will adequately explain the position of this Office.
