Legality of Allotment of M.D.S.A. Funds by State to Superintending School Committee for Use in Purchase of Equipment for Private Academy.

The superintending school committee of the Youn of Newcastle is making application to the State Department of Education for N.D.E.A. funds to be utilized for the purchase of certain equipment to be used at Lincoln Academy. The State Department of Education makes allocations of M.D.E.A. funds pursuant to a state plan promulgated under section 303 of Title III. P. L. 85-864, as amended, i.e., The Mational Defense Education Act.

The reference equipment (the symership of which would ultimately rest in the academy) would be purchased by the Newcastle superintending school committee and would be dinanced at the rate of 50 per cent from M.D.E.A. funds and 50 per cent from monies provided to the town by the academy.

· i. . . A i · The Mational Defense Education Act requires, inter alia, that plans be submitted by those states wishing to receive payments under the Act. P. L. 95-864. Title III, Section 303, as amended in 1964 by P. L. 88-665. The reference section must meet several requirements, two of which are as follows:

"(1) sets forth a program under which funds paid to the State from its allotment under section 302 (a) will be expended solely for projects approved by the State educational agency for (A) acquisition of laboratory and other special equipment (other than supplies consumed in use), including audiovisual materials and equipment, and printed and published materials (other than textbooks), suitable for use in providing education in science, mathematics, history, civics, geography, modern foreign language, English or reading in public elementary or secondary schools, or both, and of testgrading equipment for such schools and specialized equipment for audiovisual libraries

serving such schools, and such equipment may, if there exists a critical need therefor in the judgment of local school authorities, be used when available and suitable in providing education in other subject matter, and (3) minor remodeling of laboratory or other space used for such materials or equipment.

## REAGON:

The reference Act indicates clearly that State plans are to encompass public elementary or secondary schools. P. L. 85-864, Title III. Section 303. (a). (1) and (5). The fact that Songress enseted a specific provision regarding loans to nonprofit private schools is a strong indication that the latter schools were not to participate in M.D.E.A. Sunds.

The existing State plan contains sufficient language indicating that the State Department of Education was to allocate Federal monies only to public elementary and secondary schools (recognizing the provise regarding the reference loans already mentioned).
