Dear Mr. Ingraham:

This will confirm our telephone conversation concerning your service as a member of the Maine State Liquor Commission while serving as a member of the Brewer City Council. I am of the opinion that the two offices are incompatible because of the fact that as a member of the Liquor Commission you sit as a review board on the licensing actions of municipal officers. This would seem to violate the principle that offices are inconsistent when one has review functions over another. I would, consequently, recommend that you resign as a member of the Brewer City Council if you wish to continue serving on the Liquor Commission.
