A boxer's license may be suspended or revoked by the Administrative Hearing Officer as designated in Title 5, Chapters 301 to 307, upon hearing and proof that he has violated the provisions of Title 8, Chapter 5, or of any rule, regulation or order of the Commission.

In other words, if the fracas that Riccitelli was involved in constituted conduct in violation of the Commission's rules and regulations, or its orders, he can be called to a hearing to determine whether he should lose, or have suspended, his license.

If public brawls by a boxer are not covered by your rules, etc., perhaps they should be to cover these cases in the future.
