All opinions of this office in respect to whether or not Deputy Sheriffs are allowed to become Justices of the Peace or Notaries Public rely on the Opinion of the Justices, 3 Me. 484. There are seven or eight rulings of this office that Deputy Sheriffs cannot be Justices of the Peace. Some of the rulings also indicate that a Deputy Sheriff may not hold the office of a Notary Public.
