person can hold the office of deputy sheriff and selectman, I can advise you informally that if the selectman also acho as assessor the two offices are incompatible. This is a ruling that was made by this office some considerable period ago and has been in effect ever since. It is based upon the case of Howard vs. Hagrington, 114 Maine at page 446, where the Court held:

"Two offices are incompatible when the holder cannot in every instance discharge the duties of each. Incompatibility arises where the nature and duties of the two offices are such as to render it improper from considerations of public policy, for one person to retain both."
