It is my understanding that the Penobscot Tribe at a caucas on August I forted to allow absentee ballots to be used at the tribal electron in September. This is a new procedure which has never been done before and you have asked whether it is legal.

I do not find anything in the statutes relating to tribal elections which forbids the tree of absentee ballots. I can see no reason why the tribes should not use absentee ballots in their tribal elections. I would assume, of course, that the tribe would utilize the procedures set forth in the State election laws contained in Title 21. I also assume that the tribal clerk would handle the absentee ballots the same as the town or city clerks.

If any questions arise in the near future concerning the use of absentees, I will be glad to have this office assist you in setting up proper procedures.
