Conflict of Interest

This will respond to your memorandum of recent date asking whether there is a conflict between your unclassified employment as a Community Development and Research Specialist (funded with CETA moneys) at the Maine Housing Authority and your membership in the Women's political caucus, an unincorporated association.

There is no legal impediment from the standpoint of State law, to your being a member or serving as President of the Women's political caucus simultaneous with your being an unclassified employee of the Maine Housing Authority.

We intimate no opinion concerning Federal law. Any judgment to be made on that subject must come from federal authorities.
