
Revocation of Registration by Endorsement

In answer to your memorandum under date of February 6, 1975, please be advised that revocation of registration as a land surveyor in another state would not per se effectuate a revocation of registration in the State of Maine.

It is entirely possible that a licensing agency in one state might choose to suspend or revoke a registrant's certificate for conduct which the licensing agency in another state might choose to impose no sanctions relating thereto, and vice versa.

As you are well aware, under the terms of 32 M.R.S.A. § 1688 the Board of Registration of Land Surveyors is given the power of suspension and revocation. Should the Board wish to review the circumstances relating to revocation or suspension of a registrant's certificate by another state, a hearing date should be set and official notice thereof given to the registrant, apprising him of the purpose of said hearing.
