Selection of Superintendent of Schools by School Union and Community School District

A question has been raised whether a School Union may legally assess a Community School District for the services of a Superintendent of Schools plus office expenses without allowing the Community School District to vote on the question. The answer is no.

According to the provisions of 20 M.R.S.A. § 359, a Community School District may elect a Superintendent of Schools. Thus, in the event that a School Union and a Community School District cannot agree upon the employment of a Superintendent of Schools and the sharing of expenses, the Community School District may go its own way. Nothing in the laws relating to public schools in Maine authorizes a School Union, on its own motion, to assess a Superintendent's salary and expenses of his office upon a Community School District.

Although we have answered the question posed, we realize that no State issue exists. In the event a Community School District believes that a School Union has illegally assessed a Superintendent's expenses upon it, legal advice should be sought from the attorney representing the District. At the same time, before a School Union makes such an assessment, it seems advisable for it to determine, from its own attorney, whether such an assessment would be valid.
