Subject Amendments to the Maine Human Rights Act

This will respond to your request of September 22, 1975, in which you inquire as to the legal effect of certain inconsistent Human Rights enactments by the 107th Legislature.

Specifically, you ask:

1. Whether the enclosed statute prepared by the Commission and incorporating Chapters 355, 358, 151 and 357 of the Public Laws of 1975, accurately reflects the Legislature's intent of those public laws?

2. Whether the Commission can proceed to enforce the enclosed statute after October 3, 1975, until the Errors and Inconsistencies Bill to be presented at the Special Session of the 107th Legislatre?

Each of the chapters to which your inquiry refers was enacted to make a specific change in the Maine Human Rights Act. Each chapter is the culmination of a separate Legislative Document. While the Legislature could have consolidated all of the Human Rights Act Legislative Documents which were enacted into a single Legislative Document, it chose to enact each separately. As each successive Legislative Document came up for enactment, the Legislature impliedly was aware of the action it had taken on each predecessor. Consequently, later enactment of a bill inconsistent with one previously enacted did not by implication repeal the one earlier enacted. Rather, the Legislature merely enacted the specific change, leaving for the codifier the task of incorporating the cumulative changes into a single statute. The changes enacted by those chapters are as follows: 5

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The statute which you enclose does exactly what the Legislature contemplated. It codifies all the above changes in the Maine Human Rights Act which were enacted in the Regular Session of the 107th Legislature.

The Maine Human Rights Act does not give the Maine Human Rights Commission enforcement authority. The Act merely provides the Commission with investigatory functions. Enforcement may be achieved only by initiating court action. The Act gives the Commission a remedy by allowing it to commence a civil action in Superior Court pursuant to § 4611, et seq. Therefore, although the Commission may not directly enforce the enclosed statute, it may seek such enforcement by commencing an otherwise proper action in Superior Court.
