Dear Representative Carter:

This supercedes our prior letter to you of this date. After research and further consideration, we see no constitutional problem with House Amendment "A" to L.D. 2310, "AN ACT to Provide Grants and Loans for Health Education." Specifically, we believe that it is constitutional to require that contract students either practice in Maine or repay the State for the costs of their education, as provided in House Amendment "A."
