Interchangeability of Law Enforcement Credits under 5 M.R.S.A. Section 1121, Subsection 11

This responds to your memorandum of April 20, 1976 in which you pose the question whether pursuant to the provisions of 5 M.R.S.A. Section 1121, subsection 11 the service credits of a member of the State Police would be transferable to a Municipal Retirement Program if that police officer transfers to the municipality where the municipality has adopted a retirement program pursuant to 5 M.R.S.A., Section 1121, subsection 9.

The key question involves whether the term "law enforcement officer" in subsection 11 means both State Police Officers covered by subsection 10 and local police officers covered by subsection 9. The term law enforcement officers is a general term, as such, unless specific exception is contemplated in the statute it would appear to mean all law enforcement officers for whom benefits are designated under Section 1121. No exception appears in the statute so that interchangeability of substantially similar benefits among all law enforcement officers covered by Section 1121 is possible. The question as to whether or not the benefits are "substantially similar" is for the Board of the Maine State Retirement System to decide. If the benefits are substantially similar interchangeability may occur and the service credits of the State Police Officer would be transferable to the municipal retirement program.
