Dear Judy:

This is in response to your request for an opinion as to whether a State Representative is a "municipal officer" such as would be barred from serving on a charter commission necessary to implement line item budgeting legislation in a municipality. See 20 M.R.S.A. § 3752 as enacted by P.L. 1975 Chap. 738. You further ask if there is any other reason a legislator could not serve on such a charter commission.

30 M.R.S.A. § 1913 limits membership of municipal officers on charter commissions. However, a State Representative would not be so limited as a State Representative is a State Officer but not a municipal officer regulated by the provisions of section 1913. Further, there is no other provision of law which would prevent a State Representative from serving on a municipal charter commission, whether for the purpose of implementing line item budgeting legislation or for any other purpose.
