The following is the result of an oral request for an interpretation of the language contained in the "George M. Briggs Fund" as established under his will dated April 24, 1939. (Appendix A.)

FACTS:

Washington County Vocational-Technical Institute has applied to the Economic Development Administration of the U.S. Department of Commerce for a \$1,050,000 grant to establish a marine trades education center in Eastport. The Administration indicates that it will approve the grant; final approval is not expected until mid-May, 1977.

A \$450,000 local matching grant is being solicited from private corporations, foundations, and individuals. The plan is to use a local matching grant to purchase a desirable site, presently under option, which has an appraised value of \$450,000.

The federal funds will be used to renovate and equip existing buildings at the Eastport site. The proposed site, owned by the Development Credit Corporation of Maine, can be purchased for \$330,000. Written and verbal pledges in the amount of \$231,000 have been received.

To help close the gap in the local matching fund, it is requested that the State Board of Education grant up to \$90,000 from the "George M. Briggs Fund" toward the purchase of the Eastport site for the Marine Trades Education Center.

QUESTION:

Would it be proper for the State Board of Education at its May 11th, 1977, meeting to approve the use of up to \$90,000 from the "George M. Briggs Fund" to supplement the proposed federal grant for the Marine Trades Education Center at Eastport? (Appendix B.)

ANSWER:

Yes. "The George M. Briggs Fund," as set forth in his will dated April 24, 1939, states that "The Commissioner of Education, or

his successors in said office," (the present Commissioner of Educational and Cultural Services) shall disburse the income from the fund for "special purposes" in the field of vocational education. "Such special purposes" must "first meet the approval of a majority of the State Board of Education." The fund must be used "with the view of enabling the young people of Maine to be qualified to become self-supporting and useful citizens of the State."

The above guidelines will be met if the State Board authorizes the use of the money in the "George M. Briggs Fund" as requested. First, the money will be disbursed for the purposes of vocational education as required under the terms of the fund. Second, the goal of the Marine Trades Education Center in Eastport will be to educate the youth of Maine in the skills necessary to earn a living in the coastal communities of Maine.

It is my opinion that the special purpose use of the George M. Briggs Fund, proposed by WCVTI, would be within the guidelines identified in George Brigg's will.

In Witness Whereof, I have herewate set my hand and, attixed the seal of said Court this ______ twenty-fourth ______ day of ______ January______ in the year of our Ford one thousand nine hunders' and forty-four.______

Be it Remembered that I, George Millett Briggs of Turner in the County of Androscoggin and State of Maine, boing of lewful ago and of sound and disposing mind and memory, but mindful of the uncertainty of life, do make, publish and declare this my leat will and testament, hereby revoking all former wills by me made.

After the payment of my just debts, runeral charges and expenses of similatration, I dispose of my estate, as follows:

First: I give and bequesth to the Maine Wowans Christinn Temperance Union, a corporation existing under the laws of Maine, one hundred dellars (\$100.00).

Socond: I give and bequeath to the Lowiston Trust Ocenpany, two hundred dollars (200.00), to be held by it in trust, the income thereof to be paid annually by it to the Treasurer of the North Augush Cometery Association, to be used for the perpetual care of my lot in seid Cometery in which I are to be buried.

Third: I intentionally omit to make any provisions in this will for the bonefit of either of the children of my docessed son, the late Charles Arthur Imiggs.

Fourth: All of the rost, residue and remainder of my estate, I give and bequeath to the Lewiston Thust Company, a Banking Corporation existing in Lewiston, Maine, to be hold by it in brust with power to invest the same in a safe and productive manner, with the object always to be taken into account of safeguarding the principal of said fund from loss or diminition and at the same time to produce an income therear. Any reasonable charges and expenses for managing the principal of the trust fund are to be paid out of its income and any taxes assessed by any leeel, state or federal agency, against the fund on the property in which it or any part of it may be invested, and to be paid out of the income Under and ing loss of principal should occur it is to be reacted and rade good as seen as possible out of the income on and faul to the same appreciate mount and value as when first taken over by said trustee. And subject to the foregoing provisions and conditions the not income of main thruch fund is to be paid by said trustee, semiennally, to the Consissioner of Education of the State of Haine, or His sumessors in acid office, and the same by him to be deposited in a special account with the Trensurer of the State of Haine, designated "Coorge M. Briggs Fund", to be drawn by the Commissioner of Education, or his successors in said office, and disbursed by him for Vecational Education within the terms of the limitations of the testamentary provisions in this will, and for such special purposes as may first most the approval of a majority of the State Doard of Education as it may be constituted at the time of said disbursement, with the view of combling the young people of Haine to be qualified to become solf-supporting and useful citizens of the State.

Pirth: I hereby nominate the said Lewiston Trust - Company to be both executor and trustee under this will.

In Testimony Markof, I herewite act my hand and seal and dislare this to be my last will and testamont, this treaty-fourth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand nine bundred and thirty-eight at Auburn, Maine.

Subject: Request Authorization to Use the Briggs Fund to Supplement the Proposed Federal Grant for the Marine Education Center at Eastport

We are requesting authorization to use \$90,000 from the Briggs Fund to supplement the proposed federal grant for the Marine Education Center at Eastport.

Background

Washington County Vocational-Technical Institute has applied to the Economic Development Administration of the U. S. Department of Commerce for a \$1,050,000 grant to establish a Marine Trades Education Center at Eastport. The EDA indicates that it will approve the grant, but final approval is not expected until mid-May.

A \$450,000 local matching grant is being solicited from private corporations, foundations, and individuals. The plan is to use the local matching grant to purchase a desirable site, presently under option, which has an appraisal value of \$450,000.

The federal funds will be used to renovate and equip existing buildings at the Eastport site. The proposed site, owned by the Development Credit Corporation of Maine, can be purchased for \$330,000. Written pledges in the amount of \$201,000 have been received. Verbal pledges have been made for an additional \$30,000.

To help close the gap in the local matching fund it is requested that the State Board of Education grant to this project \$90,000 from the George Briggs Trust to be transferred to the escrow account of Fenton, Griffin, Chapman, Burrill (agent account number 176 801 1581 4) toward purchase of the Eastport site for the Marine Trades Education Center.

Purpose of the Briggs Fund

To be drawn upon by the Commissioner of Education for such special purposes as may first meet the approval of the majority of the State Board of Education, with a view of enabling the young people of Maine to be qualified to become self-supporting and useful citizens of the State.
