ANALYST NOTES

This section includes additional information relating to certain LDs as noted in a committee digest. This is information staff found useful and may provide useful information to users of this Digest; please note that most LDs do not have a note and lack of a note should not be interpreted as having any significance.

LD 1309 An Act to Clarify Requirements for Payment of Tuition for Children with Disabilities by the Department of Education's Child Development Services System

Although this bill was not enacted, a majority of the substance of the bill was incorporated into Public Law 2023, chapter 412, the budget bill enacted in the First Special Session. See Appropriations and Financial Affairs, Enacted Law Summary, LD 258, Part YYY.

LD 1367 An Act Regarding the Funding Formula for Adult Education

Although this bill was not enacted, the substance of the bill was incorporated into Public Law 2023, chapter 412, the budget bill enacted in the First Special Session. See Appropriations and Financial Affairs, Enacted Law Summary, LD 258, Part RRR.

LD 1499 An Act Regarding Penalties for Early Retirement for Certain Members of the Maine Public Employees Retirement System

Although this bill was not enacted, the substance of the bill was incorporated into Public Law 2023, chapter 412, the budget bill enacted in the First Special Session. See Appropriations and Financial Affairs, Enacted Law Summary, LD 258, Part DD.

LD 1522 An Act to Provide Economic Justice to Historically Disadvantaged Older Citizens by Amending the Laws Governing the Medicare Savings Program and the Elderly Low-cost Drug Program

Although this bill was not enacted, the asset test for eligibility was removed for the elderly low-cost drug program and the Medicare savings program was incorporated into Public Law 2023, chapter 412, the budget bill enacted in the First Special Session. That law also established income eligibility for qualified Medicare beneficiaries at no more than 185% of the federal poverty level and for qualified individuals at more than 185% and no more than 250% of the federal poverty level. See Appropriations and Financial Affairs, Enacted Law Summary, LD 258, Part EEEEE.

LD 1609 Resolve, Directing the Department of Education to Develop a Pilot Program to Help Maine Students Avoid Homelessness

Although LD 1609 was not enacted, the amendment to LD 1609, was incorporated into LD 258, An Act Making Unified Appropriations and Allocations from the General Fund and Other Funds for the Expenditures of State Government and Changing Certain Provisions of the Law Necessary to the Proper Operations of State Government for the Fiscal Years Ending June 30, 2023, June 30, 2024 and June 30, 2025, which became Public Law 2023, chapter 412 (see Part KKKK).

The committee amendment to LD 1609 directed the Department of Education to develop a 2-year pilot program to provide McKinney-Vento liaisons with access to emergency
