ANALYST NOTES

This section includes additional information relating to certain LDs as noted in a committee digest. This is information staff found useful and may provide useful information to users of this Digest; please note that most LDs do not have a note and lack of a note should not be interpreted as having any significance.

LD 1422 An Act to End Homelessness and Assist Students Who are Homeless by Establishing a Rental Subsidy Program

Although this bill was not enacted, a provision authorizing the Maine State Housing Authority to establish a rental subsidy program for homeless students in consultation with the Department of Education and the Department of Health and Human Services was incorporated into Public Law 2023, chapter 643, the supplemental budget bill enacted in the Second Regular Session. The program must incorporate elements to provide housing subsidies to homeless students who have not attained 18 years of age who do not have adult family members or guardians to secure housing for them. Under this provision, the authority is required to report on the progress of the program's development to the committee having jurisdiction over housing matters no later than January 15, 2025. See Appropriations and Financial Affairs, Enacted Law Summary, LD 2214, Part KKKK.

LD 1540 Resolve, to Establish an Eviction Prevention Pilot Program

Although this bill was not enacted, a provision directing the Maine State Housing Authority to establish a pilot program designed to support eviction prevention was incorporated into Public Law 2023, chapter 643, the supplemental budget bill enacted in the Second Regular Session. The program must be designed to provide eligible persons with up to \$800 per month in rental assistance paid directly to the person's landlord for a period up to 24 months. Under this provision, the authority or an entity delegated to administer the pilot program is required to submit a report to the committee having jurisdiction over housing matters no later than February 2, 2025. See Appropriations and Financial Affairs, Enacted Law Summary, LD 2214, Part KKKK.

LD 2136 An Act to Provide Financial Support for Shelters for Unhoused Individuals and Establish a Stakeholder Group to Develop a 10-year Plan to Address the Root Causes of Homelessness

Although this bill was not an acted, funding for emergency housing relief was incorporated into Public Law 2023, chapter 643, the supplemental budget bill in the Second Regular Session. See Appropriations and Financial Affairs, Enacted Law Summary, LD 2214, Part HH.
