Dear Mr. Fernstrom:

We have received your letters and checks of April 6 and April 13, 1979, and have decided to take the following action. Because your request for microfilm of the issues of the five designated Maine newspapers for the months of November and December of 1820 would result in the filming of more than 200 pages of newspaper (not including target cards which could add even more frames to the order), we made the determination to search each issue of the papers printed during the two month period and then to request microfilm for only those pages that list ballot information and election statistics. This has been done, and we are placing an order for negative microfilm of 24 pages of the five newspapers. Please note that the American Antiquarian Society does not possess any December issues of the Hallowell Gazette for 1820 and that the Hancock Gazette underwent a title change in December of 1820, from the Hancock Gazette to the Hancock Gazette and Penobscot Patriot.

We are charging you a \$ 5.00 search fee and are returning to you the \$13.00 check of April 13, 1979. If the \$12.00 check of April 6, 1979, is not sufficient to cover both the search fee and the cost of filming, you will be asked to pay the additional amount along with the postage charges upon your receipt of the microfilm. And, as usual, please allow four to six weeks for the processing of the order. Thank you for your co-operation.
