The Standing Committee on Electoral Returns

To which was referred the Returns of votes given in on the thirteenth day of September 1880 upon the proposed amendments of the Constitution relating to the Election of the Governor by a plurality instead of a majority of votes and the amendment changing the term ^{of office} of Senators and Representatives.

Report, That the number of votes thrown for the Amendment providing for the Election of the Governor by a plurality instead of a majority of votes was (57,015) fifty seven thousand and fifteen the number of votes thrown against such amendment was (35,402) thirty five thousand four hundred and two

The number of votes thrown for the amendment changing the term of office of Senators and Representatives was (61,652) sixty one thousand six hundred and fifty two

The number of votes thrown against the amendment changing the term of office of Senators and Representatives was (17,214) seventeen thousand two hundred and fourteen
