EXECUTIVE ORDER

- WHEREAS, the Committee on Aging received no appropriations for the present biennium; and
- WHEREAS, it appears from previous legislative history that the Committee on Aging has been established as a two-year committee; and
- WHEREAS, the 103rd Legislature has not yet taken action to reactivate this committee; and
- WHEREAS, a State Committee on Aging has existed by statutory authority since August 8, 1953; and
- WHEREAS, the important problems relating to the increase in numbers and attitudes concerning our older citizens deserve the attention of the Executive branch and the Legislative branch;

I HEREBY ORDER that the State Committee on Aging as presently constituted be continued to carry out the purposes for which it was created in the Private and Special Laws, Chapter 176 of 1953. I specifically direct the Committee on Aging to present legislation to the Special Session of the 103rd Legislature to continue the functions of the Committee on Aging as a permanent advisory activity to the appropriate existing state departments.
