## COOPERATIVE ACTION TO

#### PROTECT MAINE'S COASTAL ZONE

The State of Maine has embarked on a project which has put us in the forefront of all states in efforts to manage our coastal areas. The State Planning Office and a Task Force composed of many state departments and agencies, plus private, educational and institutional groups have been working since November on the first phase of this project. One of the results of this first phase is the initial definition of the coastal zone to include all coastal minor civil divisions on tidewater and associated marine areas within which conflicts may occur.


Our first task is to protect this zone from degrading developments and provide proper guidance for growth in this vital area. This must be done now before all our future options disappear. The State Planning Office must also be aware of future plans and projects in this area during the next phases of the coastal development plan.

I am, therefore, directing all state agencies and departments to refer all present and future plans for projects, developments and construction in this coastal zone to the State Planning Office for review in light of the developing coastal plan.

Furthermore, I am requesting all federal, local and regional agencies to also refer all their present and future plans for this area to the State Planning Office.

In this way, we can best coordinate all efforts toward the formulation of a realistic comprehensive plan and at the same time provide for the orderly management of one of our greatest assets, the Coast of Maine.

You will find enclosed a list of the 131 minor civil divisions which comprise the coastal zone.
