ESTABLISHING A CLEARING HOUSE FOR
FEDERAL AND OTHER NON-STATE ASSISTANCE

WHEREAS, all non-state assistance, whether partial or total, has budgetary and planning implications involving the future commitment of State resources;

WHEREAS, different proposals from State agencies may conflict or complement one another;

WHEREAS, it is vital to the State of Maine, its various agencies, and to the Executive Department that timely and accurate information be available on the extent to which State agencies are using Federal and other non-state programs to benefit the State;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kenneth M. Curtis, Governor of the State of Maine, do hereby establish a reporting procedure for Federal and other non-state assistance as follows:

1. Each department, commission, board or other agency which applies for, acquires, or expends any Federal or other non-state funds shall submit to the Bureau of Budget and to the State Planning Office, before formal application to a granting agency a brief resume of the purpose, the amount, and the planned use of such funds together with a statement as to the terms upon which any agreement is based.
2. The Budget Office and the State Planning Office shall be notified before agreement to any major alteration or change in the original application.
3. The Budget Office and the State Planning Office shall also be notified of the acceptance or the rejection of all original or amended applications.
4. The State Planning Office shall distribute on a regular basis to all agency heads a report on the status of all such applications.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED, that full compliance with the intent of this Order is a prerequisite to the allotment of funds involved.

GENERAL INFORMATION:

This Order is intended to reestablish compliance with the Executive Order issued on April 2, 1967. It is not intended to conflict in any way with the purposes of OMB Circular #A-95. The State Planning Office will issue a standard form and procedures relative to this Project Notification and Review System (State Clearing House).
