DIVISION OF COMMUNITY SERVICES

- WHEREAS, the Federal Office of Economic Opportunity has been redesignated the Community Services Administration, and
- WHEREAS, the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964 has been repealed and replaced by the Community Services Act of 1974, and
- WHEREAS, the Community Services Administration and the Community Services Act of 1974 are the funding agency and the authorizing statute respectively for the Maine Division of Economic Opportunity, and
- WHEREAS, the designation of "Community Services" better encompasses the new approaches necessary to meet the problems of the poorer segments of society in the 1970's.
- NOW, THEREFORE, I, James B. Longley, do hereby direct, under the power invested in me as Governor, that the Division of Economic Opportunity of the Executive Department shall henceforth be known as the Division of Community Services. Said Division shall retain all authority previously granted to it under its former designation and fulfill all obligations similarly incurred.
