**ORDER MODIFYING
EXECUTIVE ORDER 05 FY 01/02,
DATED MAY 9, 2002**

WHEREAS, in anticipation of a General Fund revenue shortfall in fiscal years 2001-02 and 2002-03, I have taken a number of actions, including the issuance of several Executive Orders that implemented measures to reduce state government expenditures and curtailed allotments; and

WHEREAS, one such action was the issuance of Executive Order 05 FY 01/02 on May 9, 2002 ("May 9th Executive Order") that, among other things, terminated (with certain limited exceptions) all pending and future out-of-state travel paid for by state accounts; and

WHEREAS, certain out-of-state travel important for training personnel or conducting agency business has been impacted; and

WHEREAS, the restriction currently set forth in the May 9th Executive Order applies to such travel, whether or not paid for out of the General Fund; and

WHEREAS, partial easing of this restriction would facilitate agency operations without adversely impacting the General Fund;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Angus S. King, Jr., Governor of the State of Maine, do hereby modify the May 9th Executive Order by repealing Paragraph 8 of said Order and replacing it with the following:

8. *All out-of-state travel paid in whole or part by General Fund accounts must be terminated for all future and pending requests in FY 03 with the following exceptions:*
 - *Travel directly related to the care of residents, wards, foster children and other individuals under state care or protection.*
 - *Travel required in the execution of law enforcement investigations, interstate contracts directly related to the extradition of an individual, or the transfer of an individual to or from a correctional facility.*

- *Travel directly involved in the securing of revenue, or that directly impacts revenue.*
- *Travel required in emergencies or other extraordinary circumstances necessary to maintain effective operations.*

In all other respects, the May 9th Executive Order, as amended in part herein, remains in full force and effect.

This Executive Order is effective immediately and shall remain in effect through June 30, 2003, unless modified or rescinded by Executive Order.
