STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE

AN ACT Regulating Digging of Clamworms in Washington County.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37-A, § 61, sub-§ VII, amended. Subsection VII of section 61 of chapter 37-A of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 331 of the public laws of 1959, is amended by adding at the end of the first paragraph, the following sentence:

'No person shall dig or take clamworms within the limits of the County of Washington unless such person is a resident of said county; the term "a resident" shall mean a person who has resided in this State for a term of at least 12 consecutive months and in the County of Washington for at least 6 consecutive months prior to such digging or taking.'
