**RESOLVE, Authorizing the State Military Defense Commission to Convey
Certain Land in Rockland.**

State Military Defense Commission authorized to convey certain land. Resolved: That the State Military Defense Commission be, and is, authorized and directed to convey by quitclaim deed to the City of Rockland, Knox County, the interest of the State in a certain lot or parcel of land situated in said Rockland, bounded and described as follows:

Beginning on the south side of Holmes Street at an iron bolt marking the northeast corner of land now or formerly of Charles Kiff; thence easterly by said Holmes Street about 285 feet to the westerly line of the Maine Central Railroad right-of-way; thence southeasterly by said railroad right-of-way to the westerly line of Lovejoy Street; thence southerly by said Lovejoy Street about 45 feet to land now or formerly of Lovejoy; thence westerly by land now or formerly of Lovejoy about 500 feet to land now or formerly of C. C. Filmore; thence northerly by said Filmore lot 165 feet; thence westerly still by said Filmore lot 33 feet; thence northerly by said Filmore lot and land now or formerly of the aforesaid Charles Kiff 250 feet, more or less, to the place of beginning.

Being the same premises conveyed to the State of Maine by the Inhabitants of the City of Rockland by deed dated May 11, 1954, recorded in Knox County Registry of Deeds, Book 349, Page 88.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

This land was conveyed to the State in 1954 for an Armory. This land is now no longer needed for this purpose.
