# IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE

## AN ACT Providing for Professional Immunity to Physicians and Osteopaths in Emergency Cases.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- Sec. 1. R. S., c. 66, § 9-A, additional. Chapter 66 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 9-A, to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 9-A. Immunity. No person licensed under this chapter who in good faith renders emergency care at the scene of an emergency shall be liable for any civil damages as a result of acts or omissions by such a person in rendering emergency care.'
- Sec. 2. R. S., c. 71, § 14, additional. Chapter 71 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 14, to read as follows:
- 'Sec. 14. Immunity. No person licensed under this chapter who in good faith renders emergency care at the scene of an emergency shall be liable for any civil damages as a result of acts or omissions by such a person in rendering emergency care.'
