STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Use of Artificial Lights for Lighting Game.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 37, § 97-A, additional. Chapter 37 of the Revised Statutes, as revised, is amended by adding a new section 97-A, to read as follows:

'Sec. 97-A. Use of artificial lights for lighting game. The use of artificial lights between $\frac{1}{2}$ hour after sunset and $\frac{1}{2}$ hour before sunrise to illuminate, jack, locate, attempt to locate or show up wild birds or animals shall be unlawful between September 1st and December 31st of each calendar year, except as provided in section 113, subsection IV.'
