### STATE OF MAINE

RESOLVE, in Favor of Charles A. Dean Memorial Hospital of Greenville.

Charles A. Dean Memorial Hospital; reimbursed. Resolved: That there be appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$160.57 to be paid to the Charles A. Dean Memorial Hospital of Greenville, Piscataquis County, for hospitalization for Anthoney Tomah, a Passamaquoddy Indian, Angus Morey of Shirley Mills and Henrietta Lawler, an unsettled person.

#### STATEMENT OF FACTS

The following persons received hospitalization at Charles A. Dean Memorial Hospital of Greenville:

Anthony Tomah, a Passamaquoddy Indian, was admitted to the hospital as an emergency patient on June 11, 1957 and discharged June 14, 1957. The amount of the hospitalization was for \$40.10. The hospital has never been reimbursed for this amount.

Angus Morey of Shirley Mills, was admitted as an emergency patient on June 3, 1956 and transferred to the Thayer Hospital in Waterville on June 5, 1956, where he died. Mr. Morey was a veteran of World War I, but had only 87 days of the required 90 days in order to get government hospitalization. The amount of his hospitalization was \$27.97. The hospital has not been reimbursed for the amount owed for the hospitalization of Mr. Morey.

Henrietta Lawler, an unsettled person, lived in Big Squaw Township, and is believed to have been a resident of Harmony. Harmony denies the claim based on lack of knowledge of her residence in the town. She was admitted for childbirth on December 6, 1959 and discharged on December 9, 1959. The amount of hospitalization was \$92.50 for both Henrietta Lawler and her child. According to records at the time of her admission she was 17 years of age. The hospital has not been reimbursed for the amount of the bill.
