STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE

AN ACT Providing for a Review of Laws of Forestry Department.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Review of Forestry Department laws. The Forest Commissioner is authorized, during the fiscal years commencing July 1, 1961 and terminating June 30, 1963, to study the present general provisions of the statutes relating to the Forestry Department, specifically the Revised Statutes of 1954, chapter 36, and any other chapters or sections of the laws pertaining to the Forestry Department, and to report to the next regular session of the Legislature such changes and amendments as may be necessary or desirable to consolidate such statutes to make such statutes more readily understandable, workable and useful to the persons affected thereby. For this purpose the Forestry Commissioner may employ such technical and clerical assistance and hold such public hearings as may be necessary.

Sec. 2. Appropriation. There is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund the sum of \$7,500 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1962 to carry out the purpose of this act. Said sum shall not lapse, but shall remain a continuing account until June 30, 1963.
