STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Special Deputies for Kennebec and Penobscot Counties.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 89, § 173, amended. Section 173 of chapter 89 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by chapter 326 of the public laws of 1959, is further amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 173. Special deputies in Cumberland, Kennebec and Penobscot Counties; compensation. The sheriff sheriffs of Cumberland County, Kennebec County and Penobscot County shall respectively appoint full-time deputy sheriffs, who shall serve at the pleasure of said sheriff respective sheriffs and whose special duty shall be to enforce the criminal laws in said county counties and who shall receive as compensation therefor the sum of \$11 per day and such additional pay as the respective county commissioners may approve, to be paid from the respective county treasury treasuries, together with such incidental expenses as may be necessary for the proper enforcement of said laws; bills for which shall be audited as provided in chapter 150, section 2.'
