STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Disposal of Fines Collected for Violation of Law Regulating Motor Trucks for Hire.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 48, § 32, sub-§VIII, repealed. Subsection VIII of section 32 of chapter 48 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 10 of chapter 53 of the public laws of 1957, is repealed as follows:

'VIII. All fines and forfeitures collected under the provisions of sections 19 to 33, when the arrest is made by a member of the state police or any inspector or officer employed by the commission, together with all costs taxed by the court for any such officer, shall be paid to the commission to be used in defraying the expense of administering and enforcing the provisions of said sections. When the arrest is made by any other officer all fines and forfeitures shall be paid into the treasury of the county where the offense is prosecuted. In any case, all fees taxed for any judge or recorder of any municipal court or for any trial justice shall be disposed of as the law establishing the trial court directs, and all costs taxed for any officer, other than a member of the state police or any inspector or officer employed by the commission, shall be disposed of as the law provides in other criminal cases.'
