STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE

AN ACT to Prohibit the Taking of Lobsters and Crabs During the Hours of Darkness.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., c. 37-A, § 74, sub-§ II, additional. Section 74 of chapter 37-A of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section I of chapter 331 of the public laws of 1959, is amended by adding a new subsection II, as follows:
 - II. Taking lobsters and crabs from tidal waters at night by any method unlawful. From June 1st to October 31st of each year, it is unlawful for any person to take any lobsters or crabs from the tidal waters of the State by any method during the period $\frac{1}{2}$ hour after sunset until $\frac{1}{2}$ hour before sunrise of the following morning.'
