# STATE OF MAINE

#### IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE

#### AN ACT Relating to Sick Pay for County Clerical Help.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R.S., c. 89, § 255, amended. The last sentence of section 255 of chapter 89 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 8 of chapter 372 of the public laws of 1959, is amended to read as follows:

'The county commissioners may establish reasonable office hours for offices in the county building and provide for a county pay scale for clerical help, with paid vacations of 2 weeks per year after at least a year's service and with siek pay up to 5 days a year after one year's service, and one extra day per year thereafter, said sick pay not to exceed to days a year.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 89, § 255, amended. Section 255 of chapter 89 of the Revised Statutes, as amended by section 8 of chapter 372 of the public laws of 1959, is further amended by adding at the end a new paragraph to read as follows:

'Sick leave shall be earned by each county employee at the rate of one working day for each completed full month of service. Unused sick leave may be accumulated to a total of 90 working days. When the maximum limitation has been accumulated, days that would normally thereafter be earned shall lapse.'
