STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE

AN ACT Providing that the Legislative Research Committee Study a State Building Code and Anti-Shack Statute.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. Legislative Research Committee authorized to study a state building code and anti-shack statute. The Legislative Research Committee is authorized to study the need for a state building code and anti-shack statute and to determine the best method of coordinating these provisions with municipal ordinances.

Said committee shall have authority to employ such expert and professional advisors and such clerical and office personnel as its judgment may determine within the limits of the funds provided.

The committee's report shall contain recommendations for legislation believed necessary to correct the chaotic building conditions that exist in various areas of the State. Such reports shall give specific attention to the unorganized areas of the State and the coordination of any proposed state building code and antishack statute with municipal ordinances.

Sec. 2. Appropriation. The sum of \$25,000 is appropriated from the Unappropriated Surplus of the General Fund and any balance of this appropriation as of June 30, 1962 shall not lapse but shall be carried forward into the 1962-63 fiscal year to be used for the same purposes.
