STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Use of Motor Vehicles Without Authority in any Place.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 22, § 149, amended. Section 149 of chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes, as repealed and replaced by section 3 of chapter 250 of the public laws of 1957, is amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 149. Using vehicle without authority. Whoever uses a meter vehicle upon any way, or in any other place, without authority from its owner, express or implied, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$200 or by imprisonment for not more than 9 months, or by both; and if any person be is convicted the 2nd time for a violation of the provisions of this section, he shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$200 nor more than \$500, or by imprisonment for not more than 11 months, or by both.'
