IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED
SIXTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Stopping Motor Vehicles by Siren of Police Officers.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

R. S., c. 22, § 153, amended. The 2nd paragraph of section 153 of chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding at the end, a new sentence, as follows:

'For the purposes of this section, the sounding of a siren on a vehicle driven or occupied by an officer shall be deemed to be a signal directing the operator of an overtaken vehicle to stop.'
