STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE

AN ACT Relating to Duty Upon Damaging Property by Motor Vehicles.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

Sec. 1. R. S., c. 22, § 148-E, amended. Section 148-E of chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 2 of chapter 250 of the public laws of 1957, is amended to read as follows:

'Sec. 148-E. Duty upon striking fixtures or property upon a highway. The driver of any vehicle involved in an accident resulting only in damage to fixtures or other property legally upon or adjacent to a highway shall take reasonable steps to locate and notify the owner or person in charge of such property of such fact and of his name and address and of the registration number of the vehicle he is driving and shall upon request and if available exhibit his operator's license and shall make report of such accident when and as required by section 7 of chapter 15, section 7.'

Sec. 2. R. S., c. 22, § 148-F, additional. Chapter 22 of the Revised Statutes is amended by adding a new section 148-F to read as follows:

'Sec. 148-F. Sections 148-A to 148-E apply throughout the State. Sections 148-A to 148-E shall apply upon any way or in any other place in the State.'
