IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE

RESOLVE, Providing for State Pension for Clyde P. Walker of Stratton.

Clyde P. Walker; state pension. Resolved: That a pension of \$100 per month is granted to Clyde P. Walker, of Stratton, to be paid monthly from the appropriation for special legislative pensions. Such pension shall begin July 1, 1961 and continue until otherwise provided by the Legislature.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Accident happened June 10, 1950. He was unloading chloride at a barn at Goldbrook. As he went to throw a bag up to a fellow, the floor timber let go and threw him back and snapped his head. He started having a terrible headache immediately which kept growing worse. They allowed him \$9,000 compensation from December 18, 1950 up to February 2, 1958.

All he is getting now is \$24.56 a month retirement. He has no other means to live on. His wife not only has to take care of her husband but her mother also.

Mr. Walker was a faithful employee of the State for 21 years. He was very loyal to his job and should have a special pension from the State.
