STATE OF MAINE

IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE

RESOLVE, Increasing Pension of Maurice Albert of Madawaska.

Maurice Albert; pension increased. Resolved: That a pension of \$50 per month is granted to Maurice Albert, of Madawaska, to be paid monthly from the appropriation for special legislative pensions. Such pension shall begin on July 1, 1961 and continue until otherwise provided by the Legislature.

That part of the resolves of 1953, chapter 94, which provided for a state pension for Maurice Albert, of Madawaska, is repealed.

STATEMENT OF FACTS

Mr. Albert is mentally retarded and is over 30 years of age. His parents are willing to try to care for him and can do so with additional help from the State. He is now receiving a pension of \$20 per month.
