#### STATE OF MAINE

## IN THE YEAR OF OUR LORD NINETEEN HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE

### AN ACT Relating to Retirement of Chief Warden of Inland Fisheries and Game.

Be it enacted by the People of the State of Maine, as follows:

- R. S., c. 63-A, § 6, sub-§ IV, ¶B, amended. Paragraph B of subsection IV of section 6 of chapter 63-A of the Revised Statutes, as enacted by section 1 of chapter 417 of the public laws of 1955, is amended to read as follows:
  - 'B. The retirement of any member in accordance with paragraph A of this subsection may be requested either by the member or, except in the case of a member of a fire or police department, by the head of his department. Retirement shall be compulsory at the attainment of age 60 except that on the request of the Governor with the approval of the Council, the board of trustees may permit the continuation for periods of one year, as the result of each such request, of the service of such member, and except that the Chief Warden in the Department of Inland Fisheries and Game may, if he desires, remain in service until he has attained the age of 65.'
